Events — District Governor Visits our Club

On the 20th of October we had the privilege of having The District Governor, David Clarke, pay us a visit online. To start off his talk David shared a video with us which was a representation of well functioning Rotaract clubs. He then recounted his own Rotaract story, beginning on his seventeenth birthday when he joined the Rotaract Club of Katoomba. Two years after joining Rotaract, David went to RYLA, which changed his worldview and deepened his appreciation for community service. David became a Rotarian at twenty two years old and his first international experience was as a member of the Youth Exchange committee. In 1982 David led a program to build classrooms and accommodation for a Catholic girls' school in New Ireland, Papua New Guinea. In 1985, David worked on Rotary Oceania's Rota Homes Project which was a similar program. The project involved building homes that would still stand after cyclones. A program that left a lasting impact on David was the Promise of Assurance to Children Everywhere (PACE), which exchanged Australian and Pacific Island students for a month. David and his Rotary club hosted students from several of the islands letting them spend weeks split across Sydney and Canberra. David was also a part of Rotary's Village Aide program in the Philippines where Rotarians would buy houses which would shelter families of 10 people for up to 25 years. As an engineer, David showed families how to put the house together, giving them ownership. In 1995, he, alongside four other young people, travelled for his exchange to District 5010 encompassing the Yukon, Alaska, and Eastern Russia. A big thank you to David for sharing with our Club his experiences with Rotary and his International work.
