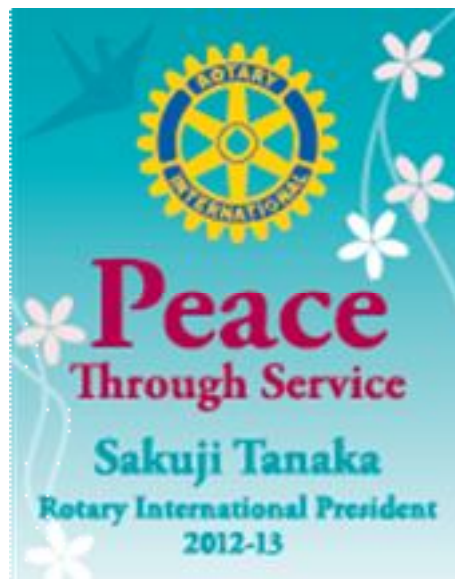

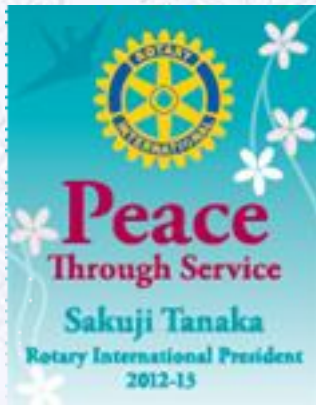

We have a plan and a stretch target for each fundraising activity and Clive's mission is to ensure the correct members and resources are engaged to achieve the plan target as a minimum. Our Avenues of Service Directors tell you what they have in store in each of their reports.

The position which is unfilled is President Elect. Following the Assembly last December I have approached several members that I consider would be ideal as president in 2013-2014, but with no success. The search continues, so if you have a glimmer of interest, or if there is anything I can do to make it possible, please see me.

The success of the Club requires the involvement of all members. Based on a survey I conducted (by email), I have allocated each member to at least one portfolio and ask that you give your full support. After all, *"you only get out of Rotary as much as you put in"*.

The new charity we are supporting this year is Brainwave Australia, the only paediatric charity which supports families who have a child with a brain illness. Operation Hope is a great cause and we are supporting them again this year. It gives young people at risk the opportunity to gain self esteem and confidence and have goals to move forward in their life. Lifeline, the charity often used by people as a last resort before self harm is also on our list, as is Warrah, the school and residential care facility at Dural for young and older citizens with mental and physical impairments. We are supporting Rotary Foundation and Rotary Health as well as many local needy organisations in our community.

We continue to be active in the Youth Exchange Program. Caitlyn is in Spain until January 2013, at which time we hope to have our next outbound, Bethany, departing. Our next inbound is Miska from Finland who arrives on 22nd July, we look forward to his arrival. Beverley and I continue our role on the District Youth Exchange Committee.

With the support of the Board and the members I am looking forward to an active, successful and enjoyable Rotary year.

Aims: To continue to grow and increase the membership by 2 – 3 new members this year, and to maintain the vibrancy and fellowship experienced by our Club.

This last year has seen the loss of several long standing members and their presence is missed. Graeme Yates passed away suddenly, John Russell decided to leave us due to his need to slow down his life, whilst our tireless worker Dick Bushell opted for a quieter life in July last year. In taking on the role of Membership Director fully this year, there are several pro-active opportunities we can all undertake which will enhance our chances of attracting new members to our club, namely taking a higher profile when the club is in the public eye, i.e. at the Garage Sale, the Book Fair, the Home Show, the Porsche Club BBQ, and maybe even at the Bunnings BBQ's. New opportunities are to be sought in this regard as well.

Of course there is always the need for current members to be always on the look out for new potential members amongst those they know, work with, socialise with, any visitors to the club should always be asked the question "Are you interested in working for the good of the community and enjoying an active social environment as well?"

This year my committee will be actively involved in promoting the club and a meeting to bring the committee together is to be held early in July.

FUND RAISING

Aim: Ensure that the fundraising target of \$37,200 set by the incoming board is achieved. Support, grow & develop newer avenues of fundraising to achieve the stretch target of \$49,000.

Strategy:

Develop a more hands on culture in the fundraising committee. Foster inclusion of and working with the Co-ordinators of each of the main fundraisers to ensure they have the resources they need & to organise ad hoc fundraisers as required.

Plan to build on our strengths and eliminate or compensate for our weaknesses both in the lead up to events & in the periods between events. In particular try to ensure that activities are both enjoyable & within the capabilities of our members and that additional resources, whether of people or equipment, are provided where appropriate.

Be adaptable. Weather may impact on key activities or special events requiring additional fundraising.

Aim to **make our events special** so that our "customers" return year after year.

Garage sale (Co-ordinator Bob Davison). Target: \$15,000 Stretch: \$20,000

Our primary fundraiser has been evolving over past years with categories given individual focus and their own champion. It has also been recognised that we need to reduce the amount of heavy & bulky items as they pose manual handling risks & if not sold are a challenge to dispose of. We will continue to adopt the 3Rs (Reduce (by being more selective in our collections), Reuse (through sale) & recycle (by separating metals , cardboard, books etc from goods left at the end of the sale).

Book Sale (Co-ordinator Clive Denmark). Target: \$8,000 Stretch: \$10,000

Moving in to its 3rd Year the Book sale is evolving rapidly. The separation, pricing & display of Special Books have proved successful. Culling, sorting, pricing will continue to be critical to ensure quality and we will also focus on marketing and advertising to draw buyers from a broader area.

Barbecues (Co-ordinator Barry Lambert). Target: \$7,500 Stretch: \$9,400

The Hills Home Show and the Porsche Day have been developed into profitable & enjoyable activities using the Club's barbecue trailer - we intend to actively seek more opportunities. The Bunnings' Barbecues continue to be good reliable fundraisers.

Golf Day (Co-ord's Tim Bowland/Clive Denmark) Target \$3000 Stretch \$4000

Organised jointly with Hunters Hill the main key to success is increasing participation. Hunters Hill may withdraw from this activity so we need to build up our base so we can run it ourselves.

Trivia Night (Co-ordinator Rob Hamer) Target: \$2500 Stretch: \$3500

A first for the Club in 2012-13 replacing the Spring Dance. We have an experienced organiser and key to financial success is for members to organise tables of friends.

Raffles (Co-ordinator Fundraising Committee) Target \$1500 Stretch \$2000+

Past Trailer Raffles had a cost in prizes and were meeting resistance from both shopping centres and the public. An option is to sell tickets in a car raffle run by Holroyd Rotary Club twice per year. They provide the tickets and prizes and the selling club retains about 75% of the value of tickets sold. This gives us the flexibility to sell for shorter periods or at select scheduled activities.
