PRESIDENT'S REPORT – 29 August 2011



We had a very interesting talk on Foster Care from our guest speaker from Wesley Dalmar who stepped into the breach at the last minute for our Partners night. The complexity of issues that come up for the social worker involved in managing and supervising these placements made one realise that the anti social behaviours of some young children are certainly not of their own making. The number of questions received indicated it was an informative and appreciated session. Out of it came the revelation that the Bickford's had looked after 17 foster babies! Tim's emotion when he told us about it showed you how much he loved them. Wow! That just demonstrates what we are on about in the paragraph below

As a result of us all having a bit of guilt about not knowing enough about Graeme Yates and how sick he was there is a realisation that we would all like to know a little more about each other and we need to facilitate that some way without being intrusive. On Monday night I introduced a

"Getting to know You a little better" session. The crash test dummy for this experiment was Channa (unknown to him beforehand). It was very enlightening and you can read Channa's little introduction to his family in this Bulletin. All members were vocally enthusiastic in their support of doing it again, so I will do it every 2-3 weeks, picking someone at random. Thank you Channa for being the guinea pig.

Getting to know You a little better

- 1 Tell us about you and your wife's **parents** (still living, where lived, occupation etc) Channa told us that his wife, Amala, has her parents still living in Sri Lanka.
- 2 Tell us about you and your wife **brothers and sisters** (eg how many, where do they live, what do they do etc) 1/2 minute

Amala's sister who is a chartered accountant also still lives in Sri Lanka. However her brother, a computer genius, is with her in Australia and lives at Castle Hill.

- 3 Tell us about your **children** (ie number ages, school/ work, married, occupation) -1 minute Amala and Channa have two children, a boy and a girl, the older at CTHS and the younger at Oakhill PS.
- 4 Tell us about your **wife** (eg where she was born, how and where you met, if she has any brothers and sisters, and what do they do, does she still work,)- **1 minute** Always a banker, Channa met his wife at the bank where she also worked. Today Amala is a doctor.
- 5 Tell us about **yourself**, where you were born, where you went to school, where you have worked and <u>what are your interests outside Rotary</u>– 1 minute The family came to Australia six years ago and recently bought a new house here in Cherrybrook.
- 6 Give us a smile or tell us a short joke 1/2 minute

Our Guest Speaker, Marcie McGowan

The Guest Speaker:

Peter Cleary introduced Marcie McGowan tonight's guest speaker. Marcie is a psychology graduate working at Wesley Dalmar, part of Wesley Mission, training carers for the foster care program. Marcie has been doing this work for 5 years.

Marcie said she would tell us what foster care is about, but firstly gave an historical oversight to the organisation. In 1894 Dalmar commenced this story of caring for children by starting a home for "waifs and strays", which moved to the Carlingford site as it grew in numbers and required new premises. In 1962 the "out of home" care initiated formal foster care and today there are 230 children, ranging in age from 0 to 18 years, in the Dalmar program.

Using a typical case as an example Marcie gave details of the circumstances which may lead to removal of a child from his or her birth parent. Often the child is dirty and unkempt, aggressive and poorly socially adjusted; whilst mother commonly meets one

or more of the following, being drunk, on drugs, mentally unwell (e.g. bipolar) or out of the house; with the child's brother or sister fathered by different men. Programs are available to help correct these negative conditions and get the family back to being able to care for their children.

Previously DOCS but now Department of Family and Community Services, DFACS, is the only organisation allowed to seek removal of children from their parent, there is an intensive set of reference items involved. Only the court can make a permanent placement.

Wesley Dalmar is funded to train foster care people who then wait for a child to be placed. The situation is tightly monitored, and child and carer are matched. Placements are made on a crisis or emergency, short term or longer term basis. Wesley Dalmar can provide accommodation for both foster carers and children; currently 3 major homes provide about 240 beds with a fourth, at Richmond to open soon.

Marcie told of the significant psychological stress on the child in placement who often feels "out of place", wonders about their other siblings and is not accustomed to a particular culture or dietary theme. Kids can't just forget the past and "move on" and some well fed and well looked after kids in care, do not feel gratitude. Policy holds that continued contact with the birth family is maintained, somewhat arguably even when the placement is permanent.

In concluding, Marcie stressed that there are many complex reasons for child abuse, it is not only bad people who do it; respect for the parent needs to be maintained.

In answering question she identified new-borns as the most common age for child placement. Teenagers are the least in number, failures are more numerous, and for this reason they are often given residential care. Asked what motivates foster carers to do this work, Marcie emphatically rejected the idea of monetary reward; saying that she believed it to be equally shared between those who wished to have children but could not do so and those who have had their own kids and are willing to give back to the less fortunate.

In giving the vote of thanks, Tim Bickford shared with the meeting that Sharon and he had been foster parents on a short term and emergency basis for 17 children. With emotion he stressed the value to society of Wesley Dalmar and its people. Thank you Marcie

The Sergeant's time: Tim Bowland won the raffle, John Russell the heads and tails.
