### Invitation ANZAC Commemorative Dinner 27 April 2010

#### Re : ANZAC Commemoration Dinner, Castle Hill RSL Club, Tuesday 27th April 2010

For the past several years our Lions Club has hosted an ANZAC Commemoration Dinner at Castle Hill RSL Club. This year's dinner is to be held on **Tuesday 27th April commencing at 6.30pm for 7.00pm** and the keynote speaker will be **Colonel Ian Ahearn (Retired)** speaking on **"The Battle of Coral – Vietnam May 1968"** - *"In May 1968, units of the 1st Australian Task Force (1ATF) confronted members of the North Vietnamese army in fierce action around Fire Support Base (FSB) Coral and FSB Balmoral in Bien Hoa province. Fighting continued into June. 26 Australian soldiers died during the battle. Australian War Memorial Senior Historian Ashley Ekins said that the battle was the most sustained and arguably most hazardous battle of the Vietnam War. "The engagements around these fire support bases rivalled in intensity and duration the*

*largest action previously by Australian soldiers during the battle of Long Tan in August 1966," he said."*

### Shelterbox Founder witnesses work in Haiti

## 10,000

The charity's CEO is in Port au Prince where **10,000** ShelterBox tents have been distributed to those left homeless in the tragedy, with thousands more tents on the way.

ShelterBox Founder Tom Henderson has seen first hand how ShelterBox tents are providing shelter to families who have lost everything in Haiti. Tom has been undertaking a field assessment of ShelterBox's operations in Haiti and meeting partner agencies who have provided support during one of the largest deployments in the charity's history. He is joined by ShelterBox's International Training Academy Manager Ben Spurway (UK) and ShelterBox Response Team member David Eby (US), one of the first aid workers to arrive in Port au Prince following the earthquake on January 12. 'This trip has enabled us to stage a detailed evaluation of the crucial work being undertaken by our response team volunteers operating in the field', Tom said. 'We have had teams on the ground in Port au Prince since the earthquake struck and we have distributed more than 10,000 tents and life-saving supplies to those most in need, with thousands more tents committed to Haiti. 'With an estimated one million Haitians still living without adequate shelter in heavy rains and the hurricane season soon approaching, there is certainly no let up in the need for emergency shelter.' ShelterBox Response Team members on



the ground say the disaster relief tents they are distributing are vital in the continued aid effort. SRT member Phil Dulo (UK), said: 'I met a family of three in Delmas staying in a shelter made of sticks lashed together with shoelaces, covered by bed sheets and walled with old cardboard boxes. They were very happy to move into a ShelterBox tent.' SRT member Jens Pagotto (NZ) added: 'The need here is still desperately unfulfilled. Our tents and family kits are in high demand. The co-operation and co-ordination between different agencies is very strong and the number of different projects we'll be working on over the next few weeks is growing all the time. 'With sometimes two or three families living in one tent, the only questions we are asked are when and how many more tents we can provide. The need shows no signs of letting up, and it's obvious that our involvement here is still as important as it was five or six weeks ago. **'Only the other day I met a boy, less than three years old, who was found left in a dumpster. He is now making a full recovery at the Miami University Field Hospital and I was told last night that there was a chance that an adoptive family or place at an orphanage was being arranged.'** Acute need Jens, who has been on numerous ShelterBox deployments, said there was a huge pressure for emergency shelter in Haiti. **'I have never seen such an acute need as there is here,' he said.** Rachel Pitot from the charity Partners With Haiti who have worked with ShelterBox in Port au Prince, said: 'It was amazing to see pregnant women going from being in the back of an old box truck with no cover to being in a ShelterBox tent safe and dry with their new baby. Many of the babies were born only hours after receiving the box! 'Thank you again for allowing us to distribute such amazing gifts to our Haitian brothers and sisters.

### How Rotarians can help in Haiti

Almost two months after a powerful earthquake shook Haiti, signs of devastation are everywhere, underscoring the long road to recovery that lies ahead. RI President John Kenny, who visited Haiti in late February, urged Rotarians to work with [District 7020](#)'s Haiti earthquake relief team coordinating aid to the nation. "What they are basically saying is, 'What we need is money,' so they can buy locally the implements that are needed to help the reconstruction," Kenny said.

More than 250,000 people are estimated to have died in the 12 January earthquake and aftershocks in Port-au-Prince, with another million homeless.

Kenny said he felt it was important to visit Haiti "to show that Rotarians worldwide care about the plight of their fellow human beings, many of whom have lost everything."

He found that the destruction was even greater than he had expected.

"When you see it on television, it's one thing," he said. "But to actually be there and see some of these buildings the way they are and to know that there are people underneath that rubble -- the sheer magnitude you can't quite capture in film."

Accompanying Kenny on his 23 February trip were Past RI Vice President Roberto Valentín; Rotarian Charles Adams, who is coordinating a disaster relief committee in the neighboring Dominican Republic; and

Ramiro Sánchez Melo, governor of District 4060 (Dominican Republic).

Past RI Director Barry Rassin and Past District Governor Richard McCombe also made a trip to Port-au-Prince earlier in the month to meet with Rotary leaders involved in relief work. Both are involved with organizing the aid effort in District 7020, which covers Haiti along with 10 other Caribbean nations and areas.

In addition to money, the district is asking for large tents that can serve as classrooms, recreation areas, community centers, or therapy shelters. Nearly all of the schools in the capital were destroyed by the earthquake.

Medical supplies and equipment, classroom materials, and agricultural tools are also needed. While food, water, and temporary shelter remain important, a report by District 7020 leaders notes that work needs to begin on sustainable housing to provide jobs, shelter, and an infrastructure to support residents. Relief workers are also being cautious about handing out free food and water because a substantial part of the economy is based on small farms and businesses, and street vendors who sell produce and other staples. Too many free items can put single-family businesses in trouble and trigger a downward economic spiral.

"The best form of aid that Rotarians can now give is cash to the Rotarians in District 7020 so that it can be used to purchase supplies of food and materials locally, protecting the local economy," Kenny said.

The RI president added that Rotarians must now help in the medium- and long-term recovery, which Rotary is set up to do well.

Rotarian Claude Surena, head of the Haiti Task Force and president of the Haitian Medical Association, is representing District 7020 on the government's Post Disaster National Assistance Committee, focused on long-term recovery.

"The road to reconstruction will be a long one," Kenny said. "But I know that Rotarians will continue to play an effective part all the way."

## Bowelscan – General information

### OBJECT OF BOWELSCAN

1. Develop Community Awareness of the nature of bowel cancer.
2. Earlier detection of potential or actual bowel cancer.

### CANCER OF THE LARGE BOWEL

- Australia has the world's highest incidence of bowel cancer - 1 in 21 (for both men and women)
- Age is an important factor. The risk begins at age 40, doubling every 5 years until age 60 and even more rapidly as the person gets older.
- Statistics show 90% of bowel cancers can be successfully cured if detected at an early stage.

**POLYPS** are growths occurring in the lining of the bowel. Not all polyps are cancerous but bowel cancers begin as polyps. They may or may not bleed and cause diarrhoea and pain. Because polyps can develop into cancer, early diagnosis and removal of all polyps is important.

**HIGH RISK:** The risk of bowel cancer increases 3 to 4 times the average if:

- One or more of your close relatives (mother, father, brother, sister or child) have had bowel cancer or polyps.
- You've previously had bowel cancer or polyps.
- You've had extensive inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis).
- You have a history of bleeding with or in the stool.

Persons in any of the above categories should consult their doctor for follow up investigation.

**NOTE:** Many bowel cancers also occur in people without high risk factors.

**ANNUAL TESTING:** It is imperative for ALL men and women over the age of 40 have a Bowelscan test EVERY YEAR. If a person has a blood relative with bowel cancer or polyps, or the person has a bowel problem, or is in doubt – they must consult their Doctor.

**OCCULT BLOOD TEST KIT:** Kits are easy to use, come with instructions, are completed in the privacy of one's home and then returned to a participating pharmacy in the foil lined envelope provided for pathology collection. The

pathology card attached to the kit must be completed and signed by the person doing the test – if detached the test becomes invalid.

### HOW DOES BOWELSCAN WORK

**Bowelscan** is simply a chemical test for screening invisible (occult) blood in the stool, which if present **may** indicate a bowel cancer or polyp. However, there may be bleeding for other reasons, i.e., not due to a cancer. In the early stages, bowel cancers and polyps do bleed intermittently. **An appointed accredited pathologist tests all kits from our Program.**

Results are sent to our Medical Coordinator, who in turn advises each participant whether they were positive or negative. In the instance of persons with a positive test, our Medical Coordinator will also advise their nominated doctor. Any further investigation or remedial treatment is managed by the participant's own doctor. Confidentiality is maintained at all times.

**NOTE:** A positive test result does not conclusively indicate a polyp or cancer, as there are many other reasons why a test can be positive. **All positive test results should be investigated.**

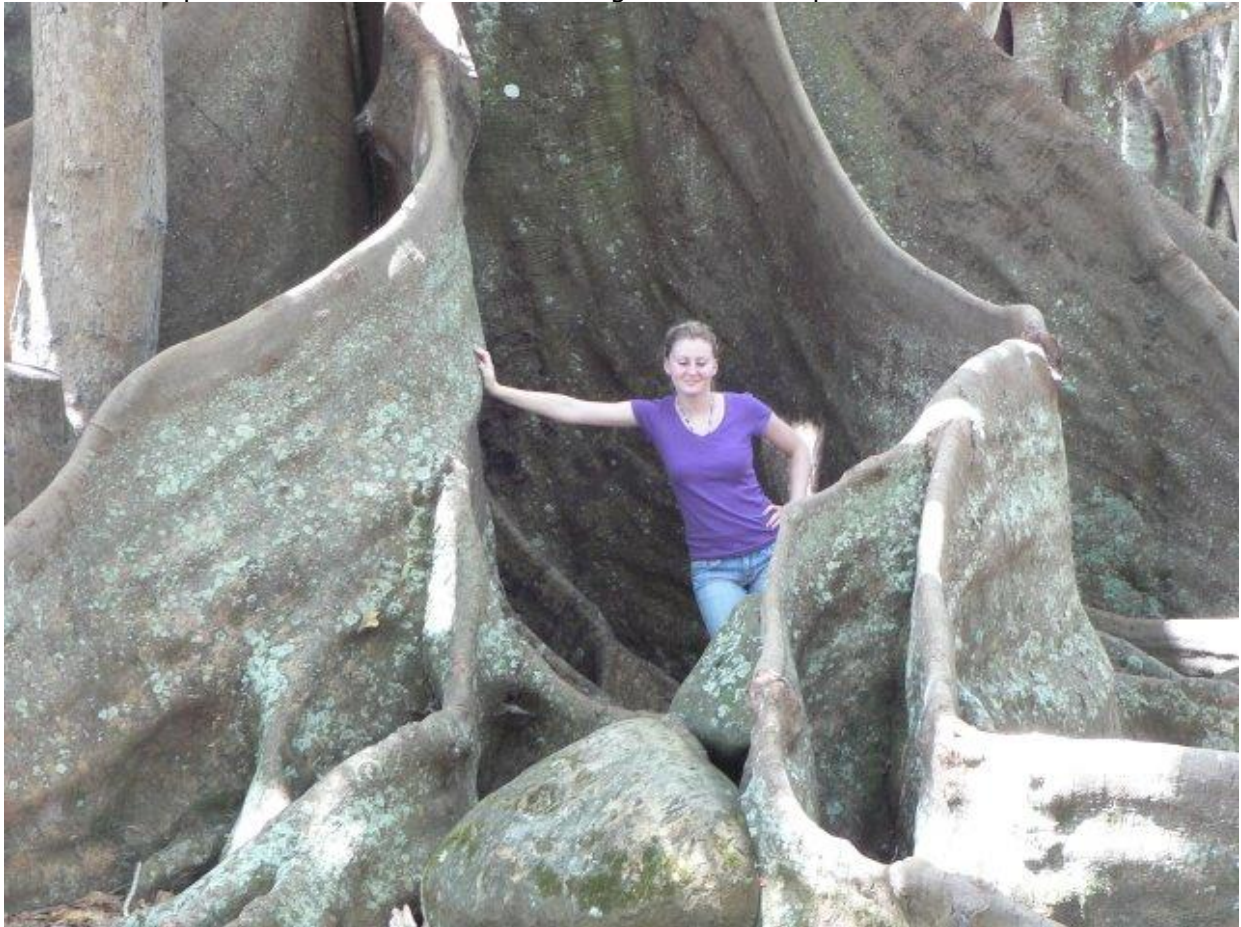

## THE BATTLE OF CORAL

### VIETNAM, MAY / JUNE 1968

In May 1968, units of the 1st Australian Task Force (1ATF) confronted members of the North Vietnamese army in fierce action around Fire Support Base (FSB) Coral and FSB Balmoral in Bien Hoa province. Fighting continued into June. 26 Australian soldiers died during the battle. Australian War Memorial Senior Historian Ashley Elkins said that the battle was the most sustained and arguably most hazardous battle of the Vietnam War. "The engagements around these fire support bases rivalled in intensity and duration the largest action previously by Australian soldiers during the battle of Long Tan in August 1966," he said.
