Presidents Report 8th August 2011

It was as a sobering talk and one was reminded that had this battle and Kokada been lost then the battle lines could easily have progressed to Australia, and the speculated "Brisbane Line" might have become a reality.

Next week our quest speaker is Keith Rowntree, Author of several books on Personal Finance.

Tim Bowland Reminded us of the Golf Day on 18th October and encouraged everyone to distribute as many flyers as possible and to widely promote this important day for our Club day

Rob Hamer gave us an update on the 'Spring Dance' on 27th august. He asked that we confirm numbers as soon as possible – we are looking for up 140 to attend.



Chairman Col Baxter introduced our guest speaker Assoc. Professor Brian Boettcher who has written several books on World War 2 including the subject of the night's talk, 'Eleven Bloody Days – The True Story of The Battle for Milne Bay'

Japanese marines attacked the Australian base at Milne Bay on the eastern tip of New Guinea on 25th August 1942, and fighting continued until the Japanese retreated on 5th September 1942.

The battle was the first in the Pacific campaign in which Allied troops decisively defeated Japanese land forces, forcing them to withdraw and completely abandon their strategic objective.

The Japanese hoped to secure an air and naval base to provide air and naval support to the Japanese Kokoda Track campaign to take Port Moresby, New Guinea by capturing the newly

constructed airfields at Milne Bay. From 4th August 1942, Japanese aircraft began to bomb Milne Bay in preparation for the landing.

This battle was the first time in the War that the Japanese had been defeated on land and the effect on the morale of all Allied servicemen in Asia and the Pacific was profound, but especially for other Australians fighting a rearguard action on the Kokoda Track.

Our Militia faced many challenges including:

- Radar that could not work because of the high humidity;
- Ill trained troops;
- Troops contracting malaria and dengue fever almost from day one;
- Little or no naval support;
- No support whatsoever from the UK.

As the title suggest the fighting was intense throughout the whole campaign. For example, 35,000 rounds of ammunition were used on the first day

During the final assault an advance by 'VC' Winner Corporal John French's Company attacked the Japanese positions but ran into terrific machine-gun and rifle fire. French's own section was held up by three machine-gun posts.

After ordering his section to take cover he advanced and silenced the first post with grenades. He then returned for more grenades, advanced again, and silenced the second post. Armed with a Thompson sub-machine gun, he then attacked the third post, firing from the hip as he went forward. When his section pushed forward, however, they found that all members of the three enemy gun crews had been killed. By the time the Australian attack was over between sixty and seventy enemies had been killed; a few days later all Japanese resistance had collapsed. During the attack French was badly hit and died in front of the gun pit.

Brian wrapped up with:

"No battle that Australia has been involved in before was so closely linked to the survival of the Australian Nation before Milne Bay".
