Tom gave us his "Hard Sell" on the Garage Sale (23-25 September)

2,000 person hours involved each year. The challenge is to see what our hourly rate is. If we make \$30,000 that equals \$15 per hour.

Team Leaders have been designated to each section and will be responsible for advising the committee of their needs (tents, tables etc.)

The Fire Station and the Guide Hall have been made available to us prior to the weekend so all stalls and sections should be all set up and ready before we open on Saturday. Any members and family who are available on Friday 23 September are asked to help on site.

There is to be no heavy lifting unless we can get contractors for this and definitely "No crap which we can't sell and have to put straight in the skip!" Tom told us that Clive's boss is our biggest donor to the Garage Sale by providing skips and removing the rubbish. This can not go on ad infinitum and soon rubbish removal will cost us

A separate phone will be used to log in all calls and requests for pick-ups. This will be shared amongst the members (2-3 days each) so that one person (ie. Jill) does not have to take every call.

Col Baxter raised some points about the productivity and efficiency of our club and how we compare to other clubs. Budgets, Total Revenues, Operating Accounts and separation of accounts were raised. Being a Veterinary Surgeon the night reporter did not understand it all but President Colin came to the rescue and assured us that everything was transparent and under control and could be discussed at any time with the Board.

Douglas gave us a very informative and enlightening discourse on 'Good Coffee Vs Crap Coffee'

Instant coffee is NOT coffee.

The largest wholesaler of coffee is Nestle a food producer, second is a soap manufacturer and third largest is Phillip Morris who make ????

The most important thing in making coffee is the Grind.

In Italy a barrister needs to train for 5 years to become qualified, in Australia the course is 5 days.

Some points of interest were

That milk is used to disguise the faults in coffee

Starbucks sells more milk than coffee

The 'Flat White' only exists in Australia and New Zealand and was invented here

Coffee should be made with water at 92-95 degrees C (97 C max)

Roasted espresso coffee loses flavour after 10 days; Ground coffee after 2 hours

When coffee has been brewed it will become bitter after 10 mins

Coffee should not be frozen or refrigerated as this will destroy the oils.

When making coffee use 5gm per 100ml of water, allow 30-90 seconds to draw, stir with a wooden chopstick, pour into a vacuum flask and seal but do not let it sit for more than 5-10 mins or it will go sour.

Thanks for a great talk Douglas but I am sure Len Evans, Huon Hooke and Max Shubert would shudder to hear you compare coffee drinking with wine tasting.
