We had just on 40 members and guests on Monday night to listen to Detective Inspector Hans Rapp who is attached to the Homicide Squad and also to welcome our newest exchange student, Louise Lastein from Denmark.

Hans, a 35 year Police veteran, is also a member of the Rotary Club of Glenhaven.

He gave a very interesting case study on the brutal murder of Nigel Stiffe at the Haymarket on 2002 and the detective work leading up to the arrest and jailing of the offenders.

As a young 19 year old Police Officer one of his first "duties" was to attend the Granville Train disaster in 1977. It is remarkable that he is still such a "happy" personality.

Louise, by all accounts, has settled in well to Rosemary and Rob's residence.

When we met her on arrival last Friday it was obvious she was going to be a delight to have at the Club. Her English is very good, although we will have to slow our speech down a bit for a while.

As a bonus she has fitted exactly into Chiara's school and sports uniform- even her shoes! Tomorrow is her first day at CTHS and she has a taken a full curriculum including advanced subjects, which we

haven't seen in a couple of years. I'm also told she is a bit of an athlete and played representative level handball in Denmark. CTHS will love that.

#### Night Report for 25 July 2011

President Colin opened the meeting and welcomed guests including our speaker for the night, Detective Hans Rupp.

A special welcome was given to our new Rotary exchange student for the year Louise Lastein from Denmark who was introduced by Alison Bowland. Louise will be staying with Rosemary and Rob Clarke for the 1st section of her stay and starts school at Cherrybrook Tech High on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup>.

Cawas then introduced Detective Hans Rupp the homicide detective in charge of Task Force Tanaro who gave a graphic account of events some years ago leading to the arrest and conviction of 4 young criminals responsible for the shooting death of Market City Tavern owner Nigel Stiffe.

After investigations lasting some 8-10 weeks the culprits were indentified by using DNA evidence found on cigarette butts in the stairwell where they hid overnight prior to the robbery.

Detective Rupp also gave us some interesting statistics regards to homicides saying that there are 80-100 murders in NSW each year, 95% of which are solved. When compared with South Africa we have a far safer country to live in as they have 18,000 murders each year.

A busy question and answer session completed a very interesting talk.
