Tuesday was the board meeting, and we discussed the points raised at the Club Forum and incorporated many of these into the program. The member minutes will be out shortly

Wednesday night was a Zone meeting at Dural Country Club to meet with District Governor John Dodd. We had 11 members & a partner attend among the 70 or so total attendance.

We were instructed to mix with other Clubs, which made for good fellowship. It was interesting to note that there was a Royal Toast to the Queen and the people of Australia but no Rotary Grace or Anthem.

Each of the Zone Club Presidents was invited to give an overview of their key projects for the year, as a means of sharing knowledge across the Zone.

The first couple of speakers gave a full rundown of just about every Rotary program there is, which was interesting to a point. I had to do a quick rethink of how I would present our Club to this group.

"The Rotary Club of WPH&C is a vibrant Club, a fun Club. We focus firstly on our social events and the rest follows. We do all those projects also". How true this is, and I certainly appreciate the effort Prue and her committee put in to ensure that fun factor. Daniel Clarke and "Tears in the Jungle" (story provided by Rob Hamer):

"In 2007 Daniel Clarke was approached by the Starlight Foundation who wanted to grant him a wish.

You see, Daniel suffers from Cerebral Palsy and is mostly confined to a wheelchair.

His family was delighted at the prospect that posed not just for Daniel but for the family as a whole. Ideas

were rushing through their heads, like a trip to Disneyland, a new computer for Daniel, maybe even a new car to carry his wheelchair. However they realised that this was Daniel's wish and he needs to make this decision himself.

He listened to what they had to say and paused. "I want to save the orang-utans in Borneo".

A selfless wish. They were all shocked. "Are you sure?", Dad asked. "What about a trip to Disneyland or a new car... for daddy?" he said in a pleading voice.

"No Dad, I want to save the orang-utans in Borneo" Daniel repeated.

The next step was to call up the Starlight Foundation and advise them of Daniel's decision. The telephone conversation was certainly interesting... "He wants to do what?"

After several days of digesting Daniel's request Mum received a telephone call from The Starlight Foundation to advise that, in their history they had never had a child who wanted such a selfless wish and were really shocked. In fact she was told they had a boardroom meeting to discuss how touched they were at its nature.

Although The Starlight Foundation tried hard to accommodate Daniel's wish they ended up settling on a compromise of a trip to Australia Zoo which, in itself, was wonderful.

He had a plan

And the Rotary Club of West Pennant Hills and Cherrybrook are going to help Daniel as have many organisations including Rotary Clubs and individuals.

Come and meet Daniel and his family and hear how they have raised over \$600,000 to date."
