

Wow, what a week we have had! I must apologise for my late report holding up the Bulletin publication, but the garage sale has been so full on.

Jan-Maree Ball gave an excellent presentation on Aussie Hero Quilts and Laundry Bags. She showed many photos of service people with their new quilt or laundry bag, and you can see the morale boost this gesture provides. It also gives purpose to the 100 or so quilters who work to achieve that big smile on the service people's faces, so a win-win project – well done Jan-Maree. And what a great idea auctioning off the quilt to raise funds for quilting materials – well done Keith, enjoy your new quilt.

In all honesty, I am writing this report the day after the Giant Garage Sale. Having the President coordinate the Garage Sale has taken its toll – there are a lot of hours and a lot of effort that go in to the garage sale, not just by me, but by the fantastic committee

I had, and by all the members who were involved in the lead-up and especially on the weekend. There are three main components to a successful sale.

We need quality product to sell. Our advertising ("We want your good stuff!!!!") was out there – papers, banners and the pamphlets (thanks to all members who did a drop or two). The calls came in, especially in the last week. Bev and I manned the phone and took a lot of calls. Many people offered to drop stuff off, and for some it was too big, or they didn't have the means, so thank you to those who did the pickups. Eight days before the sale Tom had the temporary storage erected, and it was fantastic. Volume wise it was the size of eight garages, water proof, and secure. Most importantly – it was on site – so no double handling. We were given access to the guide hall at the same time, so in those eight days before we received about 70% of the goods. We took over 160 calls (there were many people dropping off – we didn't record all those... more like 250 calls), and about 110 pick-ups. We were more selective with what we took – nearly all the bigger furniture was worth the effort.

We need customers on the day. The community knew about it, and paper advertising brought in clients from as far as Blacktown. In addition, we had excellent weather on the day so no inclement weather deterrent. People were certainly lined up at 8am Saturday.

Finally, we need you, the members. Everyone rallied, there is a lot of work with the Friday set-up, and the 6am start on Saturday. A BIG thank you to everyone. The visual impact was great, and I had many comments on how professional the garage sale was this year. Did we do a lot differently or was it incremental improvement? I'll save that discussion for my next report.

Monday night we have "Tears in the Jungle" – a multi Club meeting at Springfield House run by Rob. I do hope you have booked in – there are over 110 booked in, including out DG John Dodd. It will be an interesting night.

On Sunday 7th October we have our next Bunnings BBQ (Thornleigh) and I will be asking for volunteers.

Jan Maree Ball was our guest speaker to tell us about her programme – AUSSIE HERO QUILTS & LAUNDRY BAGS.

What an inspirational lady. She was in the army for 15years, then left to have twin boys, now 16years old and is a 'stay at home Mum'.

Jan Maree saw the blog responses of the soldiers who received quilts from the American Quilts for Velour group, which they have given out 68,000 since 2003 in the USA and there was nothing like this in Australia so she felt a need to contribute to our Aussie soldiers.

This lead to a blog being started and then the LAUNDRY BAG came into being as in the army all the laundry bags are the same and only marked by a marker pen, so many bags were lost and went to the wrong place. So have a very difference, stand out type laundry bag, the soldier laundry was very identifiable.

The came the quilts, as it can get down to -25 degrees in Afghanistan in the winter. They sent 15 laundry bags and 25 quilts and the response was overwhelming, to say the least. It gave great joy and the soldiers took these items with them everywhere. Jan Maree started to receive a lot of support from other quilters and a blog and facebook page was stated on the 1st January, 2012.

Singleton Quilters produced 60 quilts and the youngest quilter is 7 years old. A lot of people want to help their Aussie soldiers but didn't know how. This is one way of helping.

The quilts are all over, Dubai, Sinai, Afghanistan. One quilt, laundry bag and some goodies, i.e. Tim Tams can fit into a B2, Australia Post box and it goes free to the forces. Special quilts are made for the people in hospitals. Fallen Warrior Quilts are given to the families for someone else who was close to the family.

Jan Maree's sister is a teacher at Bruce Rock and she had her students write letters and send some quilts and goodies. They received and email back naming all the students. After the passing of 5 soldier friends, the parcel of quilts and goodies gave everyone a boost.

These quilts are stunning and a lot of work goes into making them.

The quilts are fully donated and the average material cost would be \$120.00 per quilt, not counting the time and love to make it. The quilts are 42" wide and 75"long.

Carwas won the raffle and Graham Evans won the Heads & Tail.

Jan Maree auctioned the quilt which Keith Ball was the highest bidder at \$200.00.

Sgt. Tim ran a very cheeky fining session (it was check shirts last week!). Not even the five partners were spared.

Another good night had by all.

'Tears in the Jungle'



Daniel and William Clarke live in Sydney, Australia, and share a passion to save the orangutan in Borneo and Sumatra

Their desire to help the orangutan happened after a series of events that helped shape Daniels decision to take a stand

Daniel has cerebral palsy and is mostly confined to a wheelchair however this doesn't stop him from doing what he believes is right

So far the boys have raised over \$600,000 to save the orangutan and have been actively promoting the orangutan's story throughout the media

Over time, Daniel and William have grown to understand the issues facing the orangutan in regards to the deforestation of their habitat due to illegal logging, establishment of palm oil plantations and the illegal pet trade

In 2008 the Orangutan Project made Daniel their National Youth Ambassador and has been fundamental in the establishment of their education program which was launched in 2010 partly fulfilling Daniel's desire to educate youth around the world

Later that same year Daniel and William travelled with their parents through the jungles of Borneo on an extroardinary adventure to see the orangutans in the wild

The 'Tears In The Jungle' book has been created as an outcome of that amazing journey
