Bob Davison has taken over as the Webmaster for the Club following the resignation of Dick Bushell. Any items to go up on our site send to Bob.



New Rotary International Offices in Parramatta

The Rotary International have moved their offices to Level 2, 60 Philip Street, Parramatta, the post office box address is unchanged. The location will be called "Rotary Centre" and the owners of the building have been good enough to allow the RI name on the building at no ongoing cost.

This new accommodation not only houses Rotary International, but the new 'Presidents Training Centre'. This large room can accommodate 70 people in theatre style, and 20 in workshop style.

The Presidents Training Centre opens up onto a very large balcony overlooking the Parramatta River (100 metres upstream of Sydney Harbour). It has an adequate kitchen that can service a TRF or RI function.

There is also a "Directors Meeting" room. This has a round table for a meeting of 6-8 people. It can be used as an office for visiting RSLs. RI have extended a welcome to come and visit the new office and have requested a call beforehand to ensure can accommodation is available
