On 11 August, RI General Secretary, Ed Futa, on behalf of the Rotary Board approved the Charter for the Rotary Club of Kiribati, adding another nation to the more than 200 countries and geographical areas on the Rotary map.

Rotary will have an important and positive impact on improving the lives of people in Kiribati, formerly the Christmas Island, says Cahrter President, Ruta Uatia, Rotary represents leadership, something we are excited to adopt here.

Instrumental in the formation of the Club was the Rotary Club of Commerce City Colorado, USA, who have been conducting RAWCS type projects there, dealing with improved medical care, water quality and educational opportunities, for some time. Members from the Club attended the Charter Dinner.

Foundation Finance

Those Centurions with smart money sense won't hang around waiting for a renewal notice to come along before they take action. The current month Official Rotary International Exchange Rate is \$1.19 cents to the US dollar and that's about 84 Aussie cents to the US dollar. This rate holds until October 31st. Current thinking is that it could go down to something like \$1.49 cents to the US dollar next month (68 Aussie cents to the US dollar) and that makes a big difference to the final US dollar contribution. The renewal form is on page 92 of this year's District Directory.

Clubs with a bit of spare cash on their books might also be thinking about getting their Goal contributions in now rather than take a chance on things getting better. Foundation Recognition Points are always calculated in US dollars.
