
Club secretary Keith Ball reminded members that the AGM is to be held on Mon 7 Dec. and an email would be sent out to all with a nomination for board positions form attached.

Colin Baxter introduced the guest speaker for the night: Dave Cushway



"fossicker" Dave is a and has been interested in fossicking since childhood. His interest in fossicking was interrupted by a stint in the Navy and Air Force but now he is a fulltime fossicker. Over the years he has made a"reasonable living" finding gold, sapphires, opals, garnett, amethyst and other minerals. He is self taught and does his own cutting, polishing and faceting. His first find was a "thunder egg" in SE Qld. He travels all around Qld, NSW, Vic and SA using his knowledge of rock formations to identify possible sites for valuable minerals.

He cautioned would-be fossickers to observe correct protocols in seeking property owners' permission to enter land, clear up any debris after exploring an area, don't enter abandoned mine shafts, observe areas on which there are existing mineral rights, preferably fossick in designated areas and don't go alone as it is easy to get lost in the bush.

Dave explained that a black opal stone uncut might be worth \$5000: however once cut and polished into a pendant, the stone might fetch \$15000. He predicted that the value of gold will double in the next year so now is the time to get fossicking!

The night finished with a lively fine session conducted by Sgt. Stan, with the heads and tails won by Channa.

Hell explained by a Chemistry Student

The following is an actual question given on a University of Washington chemistry mid term.

The answer by one student was so 'profound', that the professor shared it with his colleagues via the Internet, which is, of course, why we now have the pleasure of enjoying it as well:

Bonus Question: Is Hell exothermic (gives off heat) or endothermic (absorbs heat)?

Most of the students wrote proofs of their beliefs using Boyle's Law (gas cools when it expands and heats when it is compressed) or some variant.

One student, however, wrote the following:

First, we need to know how the mass of Hell is changing in time. So we need to know the rate at which souls are moving into Hell and the rate at which they are leaving I think that we can safely assume that once a soul gets to Hell, it will not leave.
