



Night Report

Miska made his second presentation but this one covered the whole week, which has been very busy, including ice skating, starting school (where he has already made a few friends) going to a christening in Orange with the Gilchrist family and watching a sporting event on Sunday.

Rob spoke about the Trivia Night on 25/8 and the need to get tables organized. He then spoke about Tears in the Jungle Zone Meeting on 24/9 and said the first people to book in were DG John & Janelle Dodd.

Barry Freeman welcomed our guest speaker for the evening, Alex Lopez, Chairman of Brainwave Australia.

Barry has known Alex for many years. He is a friend and a great guy who first & foremost is a businessman who loves his spreadsheets. Alex has been involved in a number of charities and was also Vice President of the Spanish Chamber of Commerce. He is also involved with feeding the homeless, running a cell in the city one night a month.

Four years ago he was introduced to Brainwave Australia by attending a function and heard a mother speak. He became involved initially on the committee and believes he was brought in because the Board knew he would shake people up and get new corporate interest, this came namely from Macquarie Bank. Brainwave Australia was founded 18 years ago by Jo Nichols a mother whose son developed a brain tumour. During his operation in Melbourne the equipment stopped working, luckily the hospital had another machine but if they hadn't her son would in all likelihood have died. Jo & her husband then decided to run a charity ball to raise funds to purchase new equipment. The ball raised \$150,000.

Brainwave Australia look after children from 0 to 18 years covering a range of conditions from brain tumours, MS, epilepsy, muscular dystrophy, autism, strokes, cerebral palsy and neurological problems from traumas. After changing the constitution they now donate funds and assistance direct to the families who need it. This is done in direct consultation with the hospital and occupational therapist involved who provide a list of assistance needed for each case. Funds purchase equipment and help to modify homes.

In cases where the child is in a country location, rather than have the child & parent travel long distances to have therapy & then travel back, Brainwave Australia will cover the cost of the therapist to spend the day with the family at home.

They also organise parent's dinners, family days, children's camps & Christmas parties. With the parent dinners they arrange for trained carers to be with the children while the family has a much needed break. Brainwave Australia receives no government funding. It receives support from corporate and community members.

We have volunteered to help with a hands on project should one be recognized.

Alex answered questions and was then thanked by Barry for a very enlightening presentation.

The raffle was won by Barry Freeman who gave his bottle of wine to Alex.

In the fine session there were a number of Olympic references, Tim Bickford fined Peter Cleary for the image he had of him cycling (Tim's children refer to it as MAMIL – Middle Aged Men in Lycra), which raised a huge laugh.


Heads & Tails was won by Peter (perhaps it was Devine retribution).


The meeting finished promptly at 8.30pm.
