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INTERNATIONAL MESSAGE

Incoming RI President D. K. Lee's theme for the year is "Make Dreams Real"

He has explained the theme along the lines

Q] What inspired your choice of *Make Dreams Real* as the RI theme?

Part of why Rotary is so exciting for me is that we are able to do more through Rotary than we could do alone. We can do more as a club than we could as an individual, we can do more as a district than we could do as a club, and when you look at all of global Rotary, you can really dream big dreams. No one individual or



even one government, no matter how powerful, could have done what we have done in polio eradication. In this year, my dream is that together we will be able to save the lives of children. That is my own dream. Part of that dream is knowing that children will be able to survive, to grow up healthy, to have better chances, to be able to see their own dreams become real in their lives.

This is DK's vision for the year

[O] President-elect Lee, what would you hope to accomplish next year as president?

I would like to see progress made in polio, both in terms of meeting the Gates [Foundation] challenge grant and in reducing the number of polio-endemic countries. I would also like to see child mortality, the terrible tragedy of preventable deaths of children, become something that every Rotarian is aware of. Every day, 30,000 children under the age of five die, most of them from preventable causes like measles, malaria, and pneumonia. I want people to realize that every day, a disaster of this size is happening. But it is also important to remember how much we have already done, and how far we have come. Children do not die of smallpox anymore, and soon they will not have polio. With the challenge grant from the Gates Foundation, we have a real chance of ending polio completely in the next few years. I see the work of eradicating polio as a key part of my focus on child mortality.

Many of the projects that Rotarians are already involved in, in the areas of water, health and hunger, and literacy, already save the lives of countless children every year. I believe that by focusing our efforts on decreasing child mortality through work in these three emphases, we will be able to make a real difference in the number of children who survive to adulthood.

CLUB PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

During the lead up to my year as president I conducted a survey of members and asked you to nominate what committee you wanted to be on. As a result you will see your name on the following lists in this plan. I encourage you to become involved with your group to make that portfolio's activities as successful as it can possibly be.

The incomming and outgoing board have decided that we will not adopt the 'New Club Plan' this year. We will keep the four avenues of service on the board as Director positions. We already have a Membership Director and we also have a Fund Raising Director.



Public Relations and Foundation will be ably represented by PDG Larry Jacka so we are looking very strong with capable leaders as we move into 08-09. I feel very proud and priveledged to be able to lead such a strong Rotary club this year. Congratulations to all those who have taken an active leadership role, please give them your full support. I believe in the old addage "you only get out of Rotary what you put in".

The empahsis this year is on Membership and Public Relations and "growing" Rotary. We have a great team assembled to lead the club into 08-09; we have a great leader in D.K.Lee at the top with a wonderful vision; and we have a truly dedicated District Team headed by DG Tony Casterley to support us.

The largest community based organisation in our area is Cherrybrook Technology High School with some 1900 students. I have started to communicate with them about a more collaborative relationship that will benefit both our organisations. We currently sponsor many programs that the CTHS students benefit from. By the time this goes to print I will have had some informal and formal meetings with the P&C Assoc to develop a plan.

After calling for suggestions from members for charities or organisations to support this year I have chosen two to be the main recipients of our fund raising efforts. **ROMAC** and **Lucas Gardens School**. ROMAC provides urgent medical treatment for children from overseas and Lucas Gardens School provides care for physically and mentally handicapped children, it is located at Canada Bay in Sydney.

We will continue with our traditional fund raising programs as seen in the following club plan, with some new initiatives to increase our fund raising potential. And greater effort will be put to raising corporate sponsorship.

We will continue to support the many traditional programs and charities. And we have some new inititives being developed under the International Service banner. We also will be pursuing the establishment of our own storage facilities at the Guide Hall.

Through a good PR effort, a new club web site, our association with the High School and the support of a great team I hope to raise the profile and awareness of our Rotary Club in the community. This will lead to many opportunities for membership and club service.

A small task force will also be established to produce a long term plan for the club. This will give us a co-ordinated approach as we enter each subsequent year of leadership n

My Dream is that we will <u>all</u> be able to say, at the end of the year, that: our club has grown, I have grown, I have enjoyed the club meetings and fellowship, I have enjoyed participating in many club activites and I feel I have made a difference.

RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN

RISK MANAGER – Peter Cleary

The principals of Risk Management have been applied to most of the major activities currently undertaken by our Club. These have been documented and relevant actions to remove, control or reduce risk have been identified and have or will be implemented at the appropriate time. During 2008-2009 the control measures will be reviewed and re-evaluated in the light of prevailing conditions to ensure their on-going relevance. All documentation is held on file.

FINANCIAL SUMMARIES

TREASURERS REPORT & BUDGET for 2008 / 2009

As in the past the club derives income for the General Account to fund club administration (operational) expenses and Fund Raising to support donations and non income producing activities such as youth exchange and similar events.

Attached to this report are the detailed budgets for both the General & Activities Accounts. These budgets are indicative of where the board believes funds will be received and expended.

Both accounts this year are designed to be close to break even. There are carry over surplus amounts of approximately \$7,000 for the General Account and \$9,000 for the Activities Account, from the 2007/08 year which will support this position.

General Account

The important adjustment to the expense budget is an increase in dinner fees of \$1 to \$28 per head. This amount provides a small surplus of \$3 to support non paying guests.

The retention of a reasonable surplus is necessary to fund unexpected costs that the board may elect to meet over the Rotary year.

Member fees are retained, without change, at \$250 per annum to meet RI, District & RDU Fees

All other income & expenditure relates to club administration costs.

Activities Account

The income account is reasonably aggressive in order to cope with forecast expenditure. In addition to the traditional garage sale & trailer raffle income we need to realise another income generating project in the second half of the Rotary year.

You will note that we have included an income amount of \$4,000 in "New Programs" which is as yet unidentified income required to meet expenditure forecasts. The continued dependence on the Garage Sale and Trailer raffle for a combined net income of approximately \$20,000 is achievable but needs support from an unidentified fund raiser than can continue on into future years.

Obviously a Garage Sale on a wet weekend would have a dramatic affect on our annual fund raising efforts.

The club supports many valuable Rotary projects by donation and also finances a number of community events and youth programs. This includes the Wesley Koni program which is now extended for a further year.

Expenditure is normally governed by income and consequently the financial support we provide is increased or reduced in accordance with the funds we raise.

Based on the budgets your board will be working hard this year to achieve their targets. Club members will be required to provide strong support as they have done in the past.
