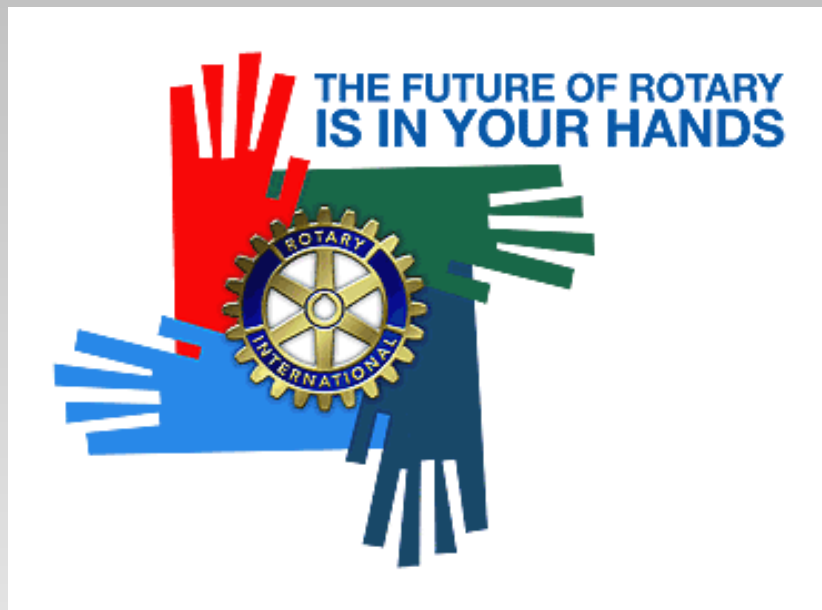

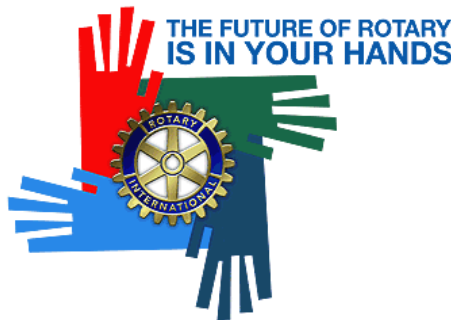


## **CLUB PLAN 2009-2010**

\*Friends of Warrah is a project initiated by Bunnings Dural in early 2009 and was agreed by members of our Club as being a worthy cause for our support in 2009-10. Friends of Warrah involves several service clubs in the Hills district who will act together or separately to assist Warrah in projects it could not otherwise undertake, but projects which can be undertaken if one or more service clubs are involved particularly through manpower, but also cooperating with fundraising. (Bush Dance and Fair are planned.)

The main Warrah facility is located at 20 Harris Road Dural. Warrah provides services for children and adults with disabilities including a Special School, therapy programs, an ATLAS transition program, Day Services for adults including employment and training programs, a bio-dynamic farm and 12 residential houses (vide [www.warrah.org](http://www.warrah.org)). It is similar to Inala in its aims and objectives but unlike Inala is off the radar screen for major corporates and receives comparably very little support. Friends of Warrah hope to do something about that and there are quite a few "hands on" projects that will give members a great feeling of satisfaction.
