CLUB PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President - Graham Cuthbertson

In looking back at our Club Plan which I presented a year ago the objectives were to continue the traditional activities while developing the club to be able to move forward into the future.

I believe we were successful in doing this throughout a very busy year in fundraising, fellowship and club activities and having some fun along the way.

Early in the year, thanks largely to the efforts of President Elect Colin McGowan and Malcolm Cameron, we were successful in our insurance claim. This lifted a burden off the shoulders of the club



on the whole and allowed us to move forward with a lot more confidence. Of the funds received, \$25,000 was distributed to the Victorian Bushfire Appeal and \$9000 each was distributed by Past Presidents Tim Bowland and Graham Evans to their nominated charities. The balance of the funds received, \$50,000, has been retained in the club accounts. This distribution list can be seen at the end of the Treasurer's Report.



As a whole, the club had a record year collecting over \$75,000 through direct fundraising.

All our traditional events were very successful except for the Trailer Raffle which was significantly down on previous years. Moving the time smoothed out the program but did not help in collections. The club is always looking for new fund raising activities and this year we had success with the Book Fair and two new sausage sizzles at the Porsche Club Day and the Home Show. We now have a very busy fund raising program throughout the year which gives the club a good base for the future.

The club's success comes from its membership and we now have 48 members having inducted 4 new members and losing 3. Everyone in the club contributes to the program in their own way and their combined efforts have made the club what it is today. A number of milestones

have been reached this year. David and Jill Turnbull having broken the \$20,000 barrier have stood down as the Garage Sale organisers after 12 years. Dick Bushell, after 18 years in the club is moving on to other things— he will be missed and Keith Ball is retiring as our Club Secretary after 11 years.

Our success is seen at conference, this year we had 32 members all dressed as Kenny and our grand entrance into the Conference centre with Chiara gracing the Port-a-loo stole the show, we won the best dressed prize again for the eleventh year in a row. This continuity has happened because of the attitude of



the members and their willingness to pitch in and help with a little bit of creativity on the side just to make it interesting. It certainly makes it fun to be a member of the club with some of



the madcap ideas we have had at conference over the years.

I could continue at length in this fashion but to sum up we have achieved our goals with a successful and busy club throughout the year. The success is because of the attitude of our members and their willingness to help in whatever way they can.

I would, in closing, like to thank all the members and their partners for their participation and help throughout the year, particularly my board which has been extremely helpful and supportive. I am confident that the strengths of the club will carry it forward to a success future. I would be remiss, of course, if I did not thank Judy for her tremendous support throughout the year. She has had her own share of challenges but has always been there to help out. I could not have done it without her.

after considering it for 5 months, rejecting it again after two separate and independent legal submissions, issuing a take it or nothing offer to us representing half of our claim (which we rejected) and finally agreement to payment in full.

Our long term Secretary Keith Ball will be standing down in July 11. The multi tasking role he carried out is not to be under estimated and we thank him for the dutiful and conscientious way he carried out his duties.

Our Welfare Officer Alan Paynter did an excellent job of liaising with members who were on the sick list. It is good medicine to get a call when you are a bit low. Alan has decided to stand down this year and we thank him for the job he has done. We were terribly saddened by the passing of Olive Turnbull, David Turnbull's mother. Olive was a long time supporter of the Club and in recognition the Club awarded her a Paul Harris Fellow in 1998. She will be sadly missed but forever in our memory.

The Community Service Objectives set for the year were as follows:

- Plan and implement a Community Service program that includes at least one significant
 —Hands-on projects involving Club members as well as implementing all established
 Club programs throughout the year
- Strengthen Club fellowship and motivation though maximum member involvement in well planned and executed Community Service projects
- To promote the profile of Rotary and to attract potential members and their involvement of the wider community

I am pleased to report that these objectives have been fulfilled.

We completed two major hands-on projects through the year.



Cherrybrook Guide Hall repairs: In the early part of the year we carried out some major refurbishment at the Cherrybrook Guide Hall repairing their toilets and rebuilding a timber walkway. This was carried out in conjunction with the annual clean up in preparation for the forthcoming Garage Sale

Warrah Pathway: The second project was the Rotary Walk at Warrah. This comprised a 175 metre long concrete path and drive way constructed and donated by Abergeldie, 150m of fencing and a gateway constructed by our Club members and, two park benches and supporting slabs, also constructed by

our members. This was finished off by the fitting of two shade umbrellas donated by Tom Westcott. All up, this project is valued at \$30,000 and showed what can be achieved by our Club through active interaction with the recipient organisation, good advanced planning and active support from the corporate world.

In addition to these two hands-on projects our club supported a range of other Community activities.



Tree of Joy: This significant project was again carried out by Brian Furrer and his committee. Charities who provided cards for us this year included Anglicare (62), Burnside Homes (150), Camp Quality (49), Forsight Foundation (32), Meals on Wheels Galston (79), Pennant Hills



Community Centre (32) and Wesley Dalmar Homes (600) making a total of 1004 cards placed on the tree at Cherrybrook shopping village.

All told about 1000 cards were prepared; 747 presents were received by the closing date, reviewed, re-labelled and sorted for distribution at the fun night held for the purpose at Jill and David Turnbull's home. A further 67 presents were received, re-carded and delivered by Tuesday 21st, a total of 814 presents. In addition to the carded presents about 60 more presents were donated and passed on to the charities Usina conservative estimate of \$40 per gift, this would total well over \$30,000 worth of gifts. A

fantastic contribution to one of our premier activities by the Community.

Nordby Picnic: The picnic was again held at the Kokoda Memorial Park for the residents of Nordby retirement village. The outing was well supported by members and partners. 
