
Brittany-- our outgoing exchange student going to Denmark. She is still involved with HSC so will be back at a later date to more formally introduce herself.

Enter Warrah and take the left fork down past the admin building then bear right up toward the school then look for the sign to Orana cottage on the right hand fork after school entrance. Head toward Orana Cottage (Park in parking area in front of cottage).

Start time : 8am on site. All materials and tools will be in place ready to go.

If it is raining on the day, call me on my mobile (0423 343 565) to see what goes before heading off.

The project involves building 75 metres of post and wire fencing as shown in last week's Bulletin.

- > We will be digging 24 post holes using a two man power operated post hold digger
- > Fixing 24 treated pine posts in said holes using quick set concrete

- > Fixing five diagonal stays on corner strainer posts
- Drilling four holes in each post \geq
- > Feeding four strands of plain fencing wire through each run of posts and fixing self strainers on each strand
- Fixing 900mm square dog mesh on the \geq three bottom strands of each wire
- Removing two existing farm gates \triangleright
- Re-fixing one of these gates into a new position on the new fence.

As you can see, there is a fair bit to do but I am hopeful we can get most of it finished in the morning session possibly with some finishing off to do in the afternoon by those that can stay on for a bit (it depends on how many can help in the morning)

- ➢ Work gloves
- > Sunscreen
- > Water bottle

 \succ I have all the tools we need but if a few of you could bring along a rake, shovel, hammer, tape measure, large pliars, saw and scissor shovel (if you have one) these would be useful additions.

Ros is going to arrange some morning tea for us and we will go out and get lunch for anyone staying over.

Hope to see as many of you there as possible as there will be something for everyone to do, regardless of your physical and/or skill limitations.

HUMOUR

(an oldie but a goodie) The Terror Alerts outside the US

The English are feeling the pinch in relation to recent terrorist threats, and have therefore raised their security level from "Miffed" to "Peeved". The Germans have increased their alert state from "Disdainful Arrogance" to "Dress in Uniform and Sing Marching Songs". They also have two higher levels: "Invade a Neighbor" and "Lose".

Belgians, on the other hand, are all on holiday as usual; the only threat they are worried about is NATO pulling out of Brussels.

The Spanish are all excited to see their new submarines ready to deploy. These beautifully designed subs have glass bottoms so the new Spanish navy can get a really good look at the old Spanish navy.

Americans meanwhile, and as usual, are carrying out pre-emptive strikes on all of their allies "just in case".

Canada doesn't have any alert levels.

New Zealand has raised its security levels - from "baaa" to "BAAAA". Due to continuing

defense cutbacks, New Zealand has only one more level of escalation, which is "I hope Australia will come and rescue us".

Australia, meanwhile, has raised its security level from "No worries" to "She'll be alright, mate". Three more escalation levels remain: "Crikey!", "I think we'll need to cancel the barbie this weekend" and "The barbie is cancelled". So far no situation has ever warranted use of the final escalation level.
