President Graham welcomed our visitors who included Gary Johnson (Cherrybrook.T.H.S), Trish & Colin Bartlett (Prostate Cancer Research), Cliff Hoare (Australian Rotary Health), Tony Molloy (Warrah Foundation), Wendy Carver (Lifeline), Kerry Souter & Nichole King

(R.D.A), potential member Mark Doran & a number of Partners.

Rob Hamer reported on progress with the Mothers Day Trailer Raffle.

1st Prize is to be a Hunter Valley Pamper Package consisting of 2 nights at Rosemount House, Dinner at Nightingales, a sparkling Breakfast at Margans & some pampering to be finalised

2nd Prize is 7 nights at Koala Cove on the Gold Coast

 3^{rd} , 4^{th} & possibly 5^{th} Prize are yet to be finalised but may include Oils & Jewellery!

The Raffle is due to kick off on Sat 26th Feb & Sunday 27th Feb & Rob asked for volunteers but was not "knocked over in the rush to sign up". President Graham remarked that that Saturday was also earmarked for a working bee at Warrah whilst Sunday was the Nordby Picnic

Alison & Helen were then asked to talk about their plans for the Book Fair.



It is to be held on Friday 11th March from 12.00 & Saturday 12th from 8.00am. (Clive had some difficulty in establishing the dates from his table for this night report & they were all fined in consequence!)

Helen reported that the advertising & selected dodger drops were working & they have had a good level of enquiries. Some good books had already been received. They asked for volunteers for Castle Hill, West Pennant Hills Valley et al to collect from callers or to have callers drop off books on the doorstep.

Helen asked if the members volunteering for these area collection points could sort into categories before bringing the books to one of the main sorting days probably to be held Friday 4th or Monday 7th March.

Chiara then gave another of her entertaining reports on the last 7 days in her life as an Exchange Student. She received 2 single Red Roses & a whole bunch of Yellow Roses for Valentines Day all from unknown admirers. On Friday she attended an exchange student function for returning outbound students & followed it with a sleepover. On the Saturday she entertained some friends from school to "a girls night in". Oh, to be young again!

President Graham then prefaced the main business of the evening by thanking Col McGowan for his work in putting together & pursuing our insurance claim. The settlement of the claim had enabled the club to make additional donations to various charities and local institutions.

Tim Bowland introduced the visiting charities and asked Graham Evans as President in 2009/10 to give a cheque for \$3000 to Colin Bartlett on behalf of Prostate Cancer Research. Colin gave a short response thanking the club and saying that the charity had been launched by Roger Climpson & Max of the Rotary Club of Lane Cove.



He said the money was well spent on research in the detection & treatment of the cancer and also benefited Breast cancer which was similar in nature.

Graham then presented Tony Molloy of the Warrah Foundation with \$6000 which he said would probably provide air conditioning at one of the centres for Day services.



& Cliff Hoare with a cheque for the Australian Rotary Health Foundation. Cliff said that not only was District 9680 one of their biggest supporters but that our club was one of the three biggest donors within our district. As an example of their work he instanced a series of 60 mental health awareness forums (6 hours x 2 days) they had run at the cost to participants of only \$30 (to cover their manuals)



Tim Bowland, as President for 2008/09, then spoke about donations to 3 organisations that could not be present. Operation Hope which is a camp for families with 10 to 16 year olds who are disabled, have experienced family breakdowns or abuse, kids at risk from drugs & alcohol or were or could become homeless. Cherrybrook Public, where we

had helped purchase a whiteboard. & CanTeen, an organisation that supports young people with Cancer.

Tim then introduced Gary Johnson from Cherrybrook T.H.S who distributed photos showing the outdoor shelters & seating which they had bought with our donation.



He also introduced Wendy Carver from Lifeline who received 2 cheques, one from 08/09 & one from 10/11.



Wendy explained that as well as the telephone counselling that they are best known for, that they run 11 other services as diverse as personal & financial counselling, emergency relief to families (of food or to help pay utility bills), transport for young people with disabilities,

& groups that cater for "angry men" & potential suicide cases. Her region of Lifeline needs about \$1m per year to operate and the government provides only \$300k. Rotary Clubs are one of their main support groups. She thanked us warmly for our 2 cheques

Finally Kerry & Nichole from RDA thanked us for our financial & hands-on support.



They showed a short DVD showing how some of their 1600 riders at 38 centres benefited by being able to ride horses. The smiles, on some quite disabled kids, said it all.

David Turnbull then launched in to his weekly fine session – taking no prisoners. Doc raised a x-fine that involved the Blue Danube & "Ladies Choice" which some of the ladies seemed a bit put out by but most of us struggled to follow. The raffle was won by Graham Evans whilst "Heads & Tails" was won by Mike Moroney

President Graham thanked all the guests for coming & said he hoped Mark would come again. He reminded everyone that next week's meeting, though still at Springfield, was on Tuesday 22nd February at a joint Meeting with 5 other clubs.

Historic Moments: The first four Rotarians

On 23 February 1905, Paul P. Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram E. Shorey gathered in Loehr's office

for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting.

Harris's desire for camaraderie among business associates brought together these four men and eventually led to an international organization of service and fellowship.

Read about each of the first four Rotarians below, and about Harry L. Ruggles, who is often called the "fifth Rotarian."

Rotary's founder, Harris, was born in Wisconsin, USA, on 19 April 1868. He was raised by his paternal grandparents in Vermont and attended the University of Vermont, Princeton, and the University of Iowa. He was Rotary president from 1910 to 1912 and a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago until his death on 27 January 1947. Learn more about the founder of Rotary in " The Life and Times of Paul Harris."

Loehr, a mining engineer, was born on 18 October 1864 in Carlinville, Illinois. He was a Rotarian for only a few years, never holding office at the club or international level. But that first Rotary meeting was held in his office, Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. He died in Chicago on 23 May 1918.

A Rotarian for only a few years, **Shorey** served as recording secretary during the club's first year. He was born in Maine in August 1862 and died in March 1944.

Schiele, a coal dealer, served as the Chicago club's first president in 1905 and Rotary International's third treasurer in 1945. Born in Terre Haute, Indiana, in 1870, Schiele attended Terre Haute Business College and served in the U.S. Army during the Spanish-American War. He was president of the Schiele Coal Company from 1902 until his retirement in 1939. He and Harris became lifelong friends and lived near each other on the South Side of Chicago. Schiele died on 17 December 1945 and is buried near Harris at Mount Hope Cemetery.

Originally from Michigan, **Ruggles** was a graduate of Northwestern University in

Evanston, Illinois, and joined Rotary at its second meeting. He was treasurer of the Chicago club during its first year, president from 1908 to 1910, and a Rotary director from 1912 to 1913. He is known for having introduced singing to Rotary club meetings. His printing company, H.L. Ruggles & Co., printed the first issue of *The National Rotarian* and the first Rotary songbook. He died on 26 October 1959, an honorary member of seven clubs in addition to his home club, the Rotary Club of Chicago.
