

Night Report

Sergeant Jim opened the meeting at 7am and welcomed Counsellor Dr. Michelle Burns, Mayor of Baulkham Hills Shire Council. He also welcomed partner Dianne Simpson.

Rosemary explained that the next meeting at Springfield is on 21st October and is the Business Network meeting. Barry Freeman is mailing out invites (22 or more) and so far we have 4 definites. If you know of a local business person to invite, forward thee details to Barry ASAP.

Barry Lambert has finalised the volunteers for Bunnings at Dural on Mon 7th October: Am: Bob Myers, Sandy, Larry. Swing: Douglas, Rosemary pm: Bob D, Barry and Helen

Ian reported that the Garage Sale grossed \$22,474 with a net of \$17,925 (then David declared late expense around \$300). So our profit was up slightly from last year.

He also advised that our audit of last year's accounts was completed 8th July – there are no issues.

Brian has asked charities to advise their need for Tree of Joy. These will be reviewed by the Tree of Joy committee (which he finalised at the time).

Colin Sharp had circulated a list for bookings for dinner at Baulkham Hills TAFE on 14th November. There are 36 places, and 34 names – Colin will circulate to the Club for the benefit of those not present (on a first in basis).

Douglas asked for volunteers for the BBQ at the Chinese Lantern Festival on Sat 26 October. Rosemary will organise a Club information display.

Bob Davison asked the Club to think of RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) nominations. This is for young people in our community (18-27 year old) with demonstrated leadership potential. Refer your recommendation to him.

He also asked for someone to host Vilde from 16 to 25 November when he and Bev are away in Phuket. Ros and Gino eagerly volunteered.

Tom (who was absent – in NZ) is organising the Porsche Car Club day on Sunday 20^{th} October. This is a great fundraiser and a great opportunity to see some great machinery. Clive will be asking for volunteers in Tom's absence, so keep the date free.

Tom has also produced some professional personalised Rotary business cards. You can have your own - \$40 for 100 cards.

Tony circulated tickets provided by the RC of Upper Blue Mountains. Ticket price \$5 for a gorgeous quilt as prize.

Jim spoke of the golf day which is Tuesday 15th October. We need sponsors (\$300 to sponsor a hole, with your signage), raffle prizes, players (\$75 to play), people need to book for the dinner (there is no meeting on Mon 14th so this is the Club event for the week, dinner cost \$50 of which \$20 is a donation). Please contact Jim or Clive. Clive commented that the Club has only a few golfers, but if we got reasonable support it is a good way to make \$3-4k (without heavy lifting!).

Rob introduced our guest speaker, Counsellor Dr. Michelle Burns. Michelle has been a Counsellor for 5 years, and the Mayor of Hills Shire for the past year.

Michelle opened her talk by saying she is often asked three questions: 1. What is it like to be Mayor? 2. Why? 3. Is the North West Rail Link actually happening? - questions she hopes to answer.

She was previously in medical research. She loved the research and discovery as you never know where it will take you. Being Mayor and a medical researcher are miles apart, but there are similarities. As Mayor she has the opportunity to improve the lives of residents, trouble shoot and solve problems. It is challenging, rewarding, and at times, exhilarating.

The State Government set a target of 100,000 additional residents over 20 years.

The shire is a mix of big block, small block homes, but we will see more apartments in town centres with access to transport, shops and infrastructure.

More people want to work near home, so there is a need to encourage start-up businesses to create jobs.

The North West Railway is a game changer. The Hills Council Chambers is being demolished (apart from admin, for construction) – Council moves to Norwest by year end. There will be increased building height around stations.

We also need to ensure green space as it is proved to benefit mental health (hence the showground will be redeveloped with a lot of green)

We have a tight knit community hence need to incorporate a social fabric.

There is an impact document (Hills Shire Plan) and there is a budget of \$100m for infrastructure over the next 4 years.

There is a plan to rejuvenate halls, sports facilities and town centres (eg Baulkham Hills) to make the area a place that people want to go.

Connectivity refers to how people move around and there are plans for footpaths, roads (but the major roads require State Government support) and events.

Michelle made a point of thanking the Club and Rotary for their work in the community, it is appreciated.

There was a lively question time, issues with local roads (State Government problem, of course), boundaries/amalgamations etc. A very informative and lively session.

The raffle and heads and tails were both won by Tony. Sandy collected the fines and commented on what a great job Jim was doing as the box was rather heavy.

A very full meeting, and Clive managed to finish at 8:27 – well done.

Garage Sale – Cupcake Decorating

'DECORATE YOUR OWN CUPCAKE' - FAMILY FUN SUNDAY 22/9/2013

Everything for this stall was donated so the money we took was all profit. We started the day with 13 dozen cupcakes, about 100 x 60ml tubs of coloured icing (enough for 2 cakes) and cake decorations – M&Ms, mini marshmallows, coloured sprinkles and mini choc buds. Jenny, Anne and Pat Baseley manned the stall on the day.

As we'd never done this before we had to make it up as we went along. We originally priced the cakes at \$1.00 each. Our first customer was a mum who had just pulled into the petrol station after her kids had been to swimming lessons - the kids saw the jumping castle and wanted to have a go! The feedback from this mum was that \$1.00 was too cheap so she voluntarily paid \$2.00 for each of her kids. Some others, with more than one kid, seemed to baulk at the \$2.00 as the other attractions were also charging \$2 a go. We finally settled on \$2.00 for 2 cakes as we had plenty, and 1 pot of icing, so for a parent with 2 kids, it was \$1.00 a cake and they shared a pot of icing (just had to fight over the colour!)

WHAT WOULD WE DO DIFFERENTLY NEXT TIME?

Icing: Instead of individual pots of icing, I think it would be better to have the various colours in larger tubs and then we'd ice the cake for the little ones and give it to them to decorate, as they couldn't quite get the spreading action going and we had to help them. The older kids, we would just give them a dollop of icing with the cake.

Have some cakes already iced/decorated for selling: As the only other food available was the BBQ, we found some people came to us looking to buy a cake to have with coffee/drinks. Pat and Anne made up a number of iced cakes for people to buy and a couple of people bought some to take home.

Price: Depends whether we want to make a bit more money, or just use the Fun Day activities to bring more people into the garage sale on the Sunday. I'd definitely charge \$2 for cakes already decorated for sale with drinks etc. – maybe still keep it at \$1.00 for the kids? Don't know – see what others think. We only had about 2 dozen cakes left at the end of the day but quite a few pots of icing.

It was interesting watching the various methods the kids used to ice the cakes – some liked the idea of putting the lollies/sprinkles into the plate and then upending the iced cake onto the stuff in the plate to see what stuck (this method was favoured by Anne!! ©). Others were a picture of studied concentration as they placed perfectly spaced M&Ms and created works of art!

We got positive feedback from a lot of the parents, saying what a great idea it was. They could leave the kids decorating the cakes while they wandered off to look at the clothing etc. We had little ones (youngest 3) up to late primary school/early teenage.

We handed over \$70 in notes during the afternoon and at the end of the day also a bag of coin (maybe about \$30 - \$50 which included the float) – total takings probably about \$100.
