Barry Lambert introduced our guest speaker Tony Gatt, Business Development and Fund Raising Manager of Foodbank. The following has been extracted from their website and from the brochures left by Tony.

Foodbank NSW is a non-denominational, community supported not-for-profit organisation, that collects unwanted food and re-distributes it to people in need through welfare agencies.

Foodbank NSW is the largest food relief agency in NSW, providing 95% of all wholesale emergency food relief in the state. It was founded in 1992 in NSW

Foodbank NSW is endorsed by the Australian Food and Grocery Council as the food industry's preferred means of disposal of surplus product, and is relied upon by charities as the "pantry of the welfare sector"

Foodbank NSW delivers 5.3 million meals a year to people in need in NSW (and more than 31 million meals nationally) but there is an ever-increasing demand that needs to be met.

Foodbank NSW supplies more than 470 charities, community groups and schools with the food it takes to feed the disadvantaged.

Foodbank NSW saves 4 million kgs of food from being dumped very year. This food not only goes to feeding the needy, but also reduces carbon dioxide emissions by 6 million kgs a year.

Australians are throwing away food worth \$5.2 billion a year.

One in three kilograms of food produced around the country is wasted, whilst at the same time Australians are going to bed hungry.

An estimated 20 to 40% of fruit and vegetables are rejected even before they reach the shops – mostly because they do not match the supermarkets' cosmetic standards.

The Environmental Impact of their work is impressive:

Dumping a kilo of beef wastes the 50,000 litres of water it took to produce that meat, throwing out a kilo of white rice will waste 2,385 litres, and wasting a kilo of potatoes costs 500 litres.

Landfill and Environmental Impact in Australia

3.28 million tonnes of food is driven to landfill in Australia each year

47% of municipal waste to landfill is food and green waste

Food waste in Australian landfills is the second largest source of methane

10% of rich countries' greenhouse gas emissions come from growing food that is never eaten

It is estimated that nationally, through redistribution, Foodbank each year saves:

19,000 cubic metres of landfill

33 million kg of carbon dioxide emissions

1.2 million litres of water

50 million MJ energy saving

28 million kgs of food

Tony's talk certainly gave us "food for thought" and judging by the number of questions was enjoyed by those present.

In an unprecedented display of good fortune, our guest speaker not only drew his own ticket for the door prize but defeated John "Heads and Tails" Fletcher in the Two Up.

Watt Park is a more introspective park, suitable for quiet reflection and relaxation. Wendy's Garden is an intimate and attractive garden space created on an area of railway land below Clark Park. It is currently leased to Council for public use. Quibaree Park is a narrow strip of waterfront land bounded by the water's edge and the railway viaduct. The Lavender Bay Foreshore is a narrow strip of waterfront land that links Quibaree Park to Luna Park, the Harbour Bridge and beyond.
