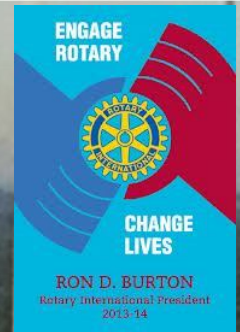

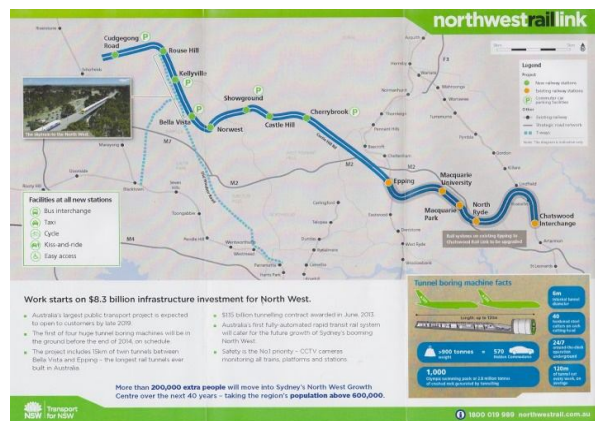
Cawas has confirmed that the Vocational Visit to KIA is on 7th April.

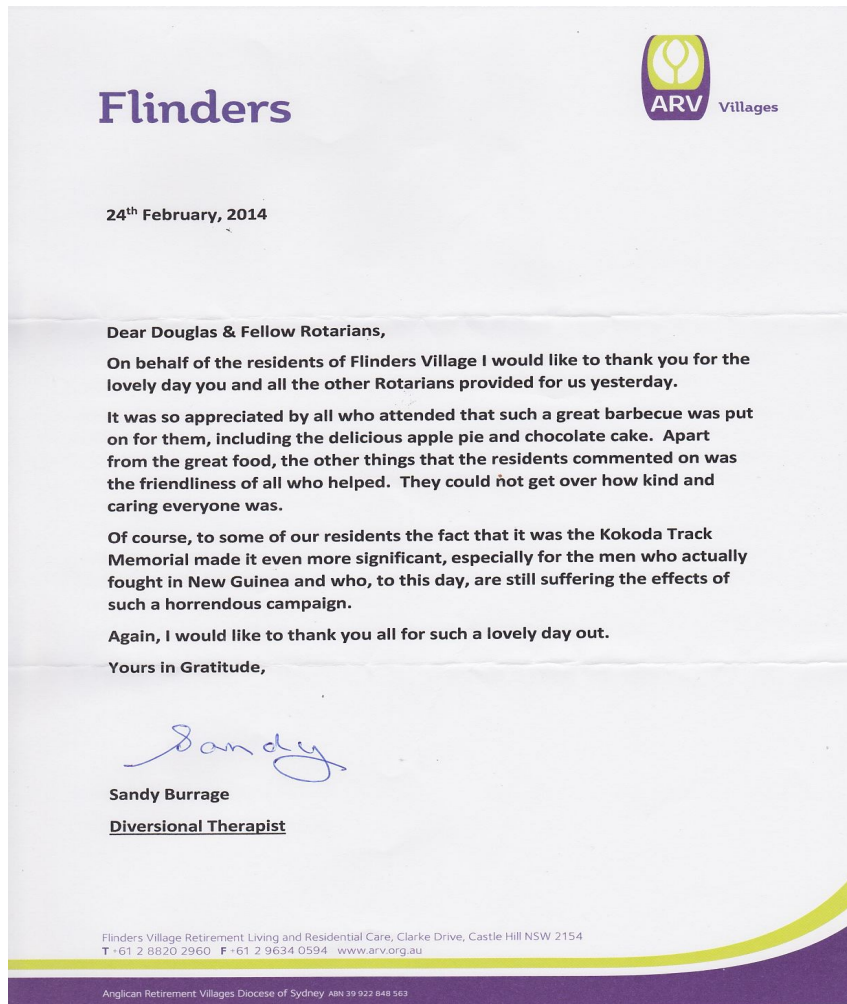
BBQ with residents from Flinders Village (ARV)



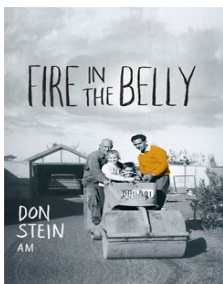
