Well, the International Convention has come & gone. I was not able to attend Wednesdays Closing Session as I had to work in Coffs but passed my ticket on to Cawas for Rashna. It will be interesting to hear what the atmosphere was like. I'm sure the "10 Tenors" & "Maria Prior" gave a good account of themselves. If it was as good as the atmosphere for "Human Nature" on the opening day then it will have been truly memorable.

When we reported back last Monday night none of us included Brett Lee's session on his musical charity in India. He was interviewed in a Q & A type fashion by Jason Morrison (ex 2GB) & came across really well. He already has established it in several cities & has bought its first bus but is interesting in expanding it eventually to over 100 cities. Brett's passions are Cricket & Music & he is using

his profile from the first & his love of the second to bring joy & purpose in to the lives of children who through ill health, being orphaned or poverty have precious little joy in their lives.

As an observation I was also struck by what a marvellous legacy has been left by the Olympics. The old Acer arena (now called Allphones) was a great venue. (it will also host an ice show, an ice hockey match USA v Canada, a bull riding contest & a Lady Gaga concert in the next few months.) The buildings that were used for Registration & the House of Friendship were spacious & had excellent amenities & there was so much space for wandering that 20,000 people never seemed to create any real overcrowding. A number of little trains were put on to help those that found the distances too much! The NSW government did its bit too by supplying trains, bus and ferries free to Rotarians for the week & I'm sure that got repaid many times over by the monies spent on hotels, meals & purchases by the Interstate & Overseas visitors.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the Volunteers (both Rotarians & a mix of others) who helped the overseas travellers find their way around the site but also around Sydney. Our own Barry Lambert was a good example spending 5 days at Central Railway station amongst a total roster, at that location alone, of 65 people whilst Larry Jacka did a stint at the Olympic site. Rotarians also provided some home hosting. Rob & Janet Hamer looked after a nice couple from Texas (Harv & Kay) who I had a chance to chat to when Rob kindly took me in to the Olympic site. Bob & Bev also hosted three overseas exchange students living in Queensland.

My year is drawing to a close. Next meeting on Monday 16th June has **The Sydney Youth Musical theatre & partners are welcome**. The Changeover Dinner is on Saturday 21st at the Madison. Please pay next Monday or by the direct debit that Barry has sent to you. Stan won the raffle again and Barry Lambert won the heads & Tails.


Frank excelled himself with the meal and members around me voted 9.5 out of 10.

See Hairspray the Musical


