


Vivid Lights Tour 29th May

Where's Howard?

One of Australia's Great Road Adventures. Crossing the Nullarbor Plains.

Once fraught with bulldust and potholes, today the Eyre Highway poses few problems
The road is wide and sealed from beginning to end with plenty of good rest areas along the way so we can stop and revive. Many dismiss the route as being tedious to the extreme but frankly, it can be a great adventure and a highlight of any journey - it's simply a state of mind and all to do with how you approach it!

The longest stretches between fuel stops are from Norseman to Balladonia (193km), Balladonia to Caiguna (182km) and from the WA/SA border to Nullarbor Roadhouse (185km); otherwise, roadhouses and emergency telephones are dotted at fairly regular intervals along the route. Signs will tell us how far it is to the next stop, so we are able to plan our trip as we go.

Some of the biggest hazards that we may face are fatigue and straying stock. We keep to the speed limit, making use of the



numerous, well set up rest areas and stay alert. We carry drinking water with us - the tanks along the highway are unreliable and prone to vandalism. Also the Royal Flying Doctor Service occasionally uses the highway to make a landing - we see relevant signs and markings on the bitumen roads indicating the "runways". Landings are always heralded by personnel located on the road itself - police, roadhouse staff or others seconded for the purpose - so we would have plenty of warning of an impending arrival. It's a rare occurrence, but it does happen!

It took us 10 days to cross the Nullarbor, (the locals call it "The Paddock"), taking many photos of the Bunda Cliffs and the Great Southern Ocean where the whales come to breed in the winter time. From some of my notes. Howard and Megan







Janelle and her family have been Cherrybrook residents since 1998 and she has been active within the local community for most of that time. She served as the Chairperson of the Cherrybrook Guides Support Group for 4 years, managed Amelia's Cherrybrook United netball team for 6 years, and has volunteered at John Purchase Public School since 2003 and Cherrybrook Technology High School since 2010 – in fact she's still on CTHS canteen roster this year despite her son completing the HSC there last year.
